Wearing masks on planes and trains is not required but strongly recommended

The information presented today is for international travelers arriving by air

Airports in Canada that accept international flights are <u>port-of-entry airports</u>: Calgary, Montreal, Toronto, Vancouver, Halifax, Ottawa, Quebec City, Winnipeg, Edmonton, among others.

There are three airports in New Brunswick that receive flights from out of province:

Fredericton, Moncton, Saint John

- 1. Review the <u>Travel Restrictions and Preparing to Enter Canada</u> document on the Visas, Permits, & Immigration section of the NBCC Website

 This will be updated regularly; Step by step guide (but not comprehensive)
- 2. Review the NBCC Travel Guide that can be found at www.nbcc.ca/travel-guide
- 3. Recommended: Submit your NBCC arrival plan at www.nbcca.ca/travel-guide (online form is located on that website)

Once you submit your plan, this will enroll you in our Travel Check-In program

4. Purchase early-arrival insurance

Spring 2024: You will receive further information about your <u>guard.me coverage</u> in the coming months. Coverage is for the student only and <u>starts on April 20, 2024</u>.









- Proof of Medical Exam (if applicable)
- Letter of Introduction from IRCC (study permit approval letter)
- NBCC Letter of Acceptance

eTA/Temporary Resident Visa (Canadian entry document)

NBCC Travel Support Letter (www.nbcc.ca/travel-guide)





Flight staff will confirm that you have all necessary documents. Be ready to show them ever Aething. #



- You will complete a customs declaration (you can use ArriveCAN to do this in advance).
- You will approach a counter to speak to a Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) agent.
- You may be referred to a second CBSA agent. You have the right to a translator if you need one.



Even if you have been approved for a study permit, the border officer makes the final decision on your entry to Canada.


You must complete this step at your port-of-entry airport.

Stay calm

No matter your nationality, and no matter the country, crossing any border is stressful

Be organized with your documents and your information Overprepare – bring lots of supporting documentation!

Be patient, polite and honest Know your NBCC program & reason for studying Advocate for yourself Practice what you will say

Remember: You are agreeing to meet the conditions of an international student in Canada

You must leave Canada, apply to extend your study permit, or change your status to a visitor or temporary worker by the expiry date. You may have to prove that you will leave Canada at the end of your stay.
